Working Together

Among the 12 Apostles of Jesus was Simon, who before becoming an apostle had been a Zealot (Luke 6:15). Zealots were anti-Roman government extremists, devoted to the Jewish law and religion. They thought it was treason against God to pay taxes to the Roman emperor, since God alone was Israel's king. They were willing to fight to the death for Jewish independence.

Then there was Matthew, a tax collector (Matt 10:3). Tax collectors were despised by the Zealots and other Jews. They were classified generally as "sinners" (Matt 9:10-11; Mark 2:15). But even further, the tax collectors were hated because their fellow countrymen viewed them as traitors who worked for Rome, an oppressor of the Jewish people. Yet these two disciples on opposite ends of the political spectrum apparently put aside their differences and worked together for the cause of Christ, which is the most important cause of all because it involves eternal life!

In speaking of the different parts of the body of Christ in the first century, the apostle Paul writes in 1Corinthians 12:4-27:

"There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all... For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. For in fact the body is not one member but many... But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased. And if they were all one member, where would the body be? But now indeed there are many members, yet one body. And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." ... But God composed the body, having given greater honor to that part which lacks it, that there should be no schism in the body, but that the members should have the same care for one another. And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it. Now **YOU** are the body of Christ, and members individually.

In the body of Christ, no matter what our political preferences are, we must find a way to work together to promote the cause of Christ. If Simon and Matthew could do it so can we! "Be kind to one another, tender hearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you" (Eph 4:32).
