Leaders With a Broken Heart

Leadership is a hard but necessary duty. The 'pay' is low and the criticism is high at times. Whenever a decision is made, then come the comments and reactions toward the leadership. However, it is a responsibility that the Lord expects godly men to carry out. We can find many examples of leaders in the Bible and the challenges they had to face.

Noah, who obeyed one of the most incredible commands to build a huge ship to live in when the world-wide flood occurred. The faith Noah had was amazing (Genesis 6:22). He preached his heart out, warning every living person he could while the ark was being prepared (1 Peter 3:20; 2 Peter 2:5). The sad, sinking feeling he must have felt when the door of the ark was closed with only eight people aboard (Genesis 7:13).

What did Moses experience? He was given the responsibility of leading the Israelite nation out of Egypt and through the wilderness to the promised land (Exodus 3:7-10). What kind of response did the people have toward God's leader? At Rephidim, there was no water to drink so "...the people contended with Moses...the people complained against Moses, and said, 'Why is it you have brought us up out of Egypt, to kill us...with thirst?" (Exodus 17:1-4). The Israelites were ready to stone him. Moses didn't seek this job, but it was given to him. It must have been personally painful to Moses as the majority of the people ages twenty and upward died in the wilderness because of their unbelief (Numbers 14:29).

Then there were Samuel's difficulties. All the elders of Israel told him, "You are old, and your sons do not follow the Lord, so now give us a king to judge us" (1 Samuel 8:5). He felt rejected as an older person and as a parent of disobedient children. The Lord encouraged Samuel, "...they have not rejected you, but they have rejected Me, that I should not reign over them" (1 Samuel 8:7). How discouraged this leader was.

Elijah watched God powerfully defeat the 450 prophets of Baal and prove their idol was false (1 Kings 18:21-39). Elijah seized the prophets of Baal and had them executed (1 Kings 18:40). This event was told to Queen Jezebel, so she sent word to Elijah that he would be killed within 24 hours (1 Kings 19:2). This man of God became depressed, ran away, and felt that he was the only faithful prophet left (1 Kings 19:4-10). At this point, Jehovah's power didn't seem enough for him. He would just as soon give up and die. He was all alone, at least it seemed that way for a period of time.

What about God's Son who came to earth to lead people out of sin? He blessed the people, teaching them about the great work of God that provided eternal life for those who would believe in Him (John 6:27-40). The previous day, Jesus compassionately fed over 5000 men (John 6:10-13). The multitude of disciples needed to make a commitment concerning who Jesus was and follow Him. Instead, they complained and many went away and followed Him no more (John 6:61.66). This must have been one of the lowest moments in Christ's ministry.

The Bible reveals examples of God's leaders experiencing difficult and discouraging periods. There were definite down times in their service of God's people. No one said being a leader is easy. One might even say it is heartbreaking at times. Please hold up all leaders, our elders, and preachers to God in your prayers.
